

# WILMINGTON MIDDLE SCHOOL PAC MINUTES SEPTEMBER 28,2021 VIA ZOOM

The meeting was called to order by Jen Jackson at 7:36 pm.

#### Approval of Agenda

Welcome: Jen J. welcomed everyone to the first PAC meeting of the school year; attendees introduced themselves

## Principal's Report: Dr. Quirk

- @690 students in the building: 240 6th graders, 189 7th graders, 261 8th graders; less than in the past (>900)
- "Still ironing out lunch"
- First half-day tomorrow, CIT; students will work on iReady and data will be analyzed by teachers to assess reading skills
- There were 6 Q&A forms collected from parents/guardians:
  - \* Most questions were regarding lockers. Lockers are available to students now and they are able to ask to go to them whenever they want; they need to use a pass and sign out. Dr. Quirk will use the sign out sheets to monitor when they are being used.
  - \*There was a question about the student survey Dr. Quirk plans to send out about how the school year is going for them. She would like to do this once per quarter.
  - \* One parent had a concern that there is not a lot of interaction among students. Dr. Quirk feels there definitely is especially at lunch and during gym.
  - \*Dr. Quirk will formally type Q&A out to include in the meeting minutes

#### Treasurer's Report: Shannon Sheridan-Geldart

- Current balance \$5051.34
- Two purchases made: ice cream for 6th grade Ice Cream Social/scavenger\* (Aug. 19) and 6th grade goodie bags; \*note: a lot of ice cream was left over
